The Ruptured Duck

We have a unique piece of history from WWII that fits in the palm of your hand. At the museum, it is found on the 1943 Cracker Jack uniform on the wall behind the "Delta" desk, along with several other historic military uniforms.

The Ruptured Duck was issued as a sign of an honorable discharge, and although usually associated with WWII, it began in 1919. The pin depicts an eagle, who appears to start to take flight with outstretched wings within a wreath.

The patch, and later pin (found in metal and plastic versions), was created to allow Honorably Discharged military personnel to wear their uniforms for a period of time after they left military service due to their inability to afford or find (due to shortages) civilian clothes while at the same time identifying themselves as not actively serving. When applying for work or veteran's benefits, Honorably Discharged personnel wearing civilian clothes could quickly identify their former military status using the pin version of the patch.

How this pin received its name varies widely with myths and legends galore. Stories of its nickname vary,

from the pin design looking like a duck to a quote from Hedy Lamarr, the incredibly talented technology inventor and famous actress that had escaped from Nazi Germany. (Common Myths About The Honorable Discharge, n.d.) Ms. Lamarr was quoted as saying that her terrible and hazardous flight originated -- in the actress's words -- on a 'broken bird'... ("segeltuch gebrochen"). In English, the German "segeltuch gebrochen" spoken by Ms. Hedy Lamarr translates to "Ruptured Duck". The myth about Ms. Lamarr's quote is

attributed to Louis B. Mayer to help her waning career.

And this tiny piece of history provides clues to the conditions from that period that most wouldn't understand today. Approximately 16 million Americans served in uniform during WWII; when the war ended, they returned home. (Ortiz, 2023) Cloth rationing during the war created a clothing shortage in the U.S. The millions of troops returning simultaneously would only worsen things.
